





- Acquisition of a large format printer/scanner allowing the department to print large scale plans for permit holders.




Incidents - By Type

Total incidents April - June







 - 99 mattresses were collected.


Engineering and Design

Public Works Successes:


- Clean Roadways For Earth Day campaign:




Work Orders - Distribution
